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Discussion Questions

- What's been one small win you've had this week?
- When have you felt surprisingly welcome by a community? What made it feel easy to belong?
- A healthy church asks three questions, in order: Who is Jesus? (Christology), What is His mission? (Missiology), and How does the church function? (Ecclesiology). Which of these three questions do you feel most comfortable answering, which do you feel least equipped to answer?
- **Read Luke 19:10**

- If you asked Jesus, “Why did you come?” This is His answer. How does that reshape what a local church should celebrate most?
 - Who is one person (first name only) you sense Jesus is “seeking” in your world? What makes you say that?
 - **Read Acts 15:19**
 - What are unnecessary barriers churches sometimes put in the way of people turning to God? Which one do you notice most?
 - What’s one barrier you could personally remove for a friend?
 - **Read 1 Corinthians 14:19**
 - Where do we confuse “deep” with “unclear” in Christian spaces? How can clarity actually honor the spiritually curious and long-time Jesus followers?
 - If you had to explain “grace,” “gospel,” or “baptism” in a single sentence to a friend, how would you say it?
 - During the message it was said that: *“We get all eternity to worship. We get 80 years to rob hell.”*
 - What distracts you the most from the mission Jesus gives us?
 - What’s your biggest fear about engaging some spiritually (not knowing enough, getting rejected, past baggage, etc.)? What would courage look like in light of that?
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Challenge Question (For Takeaway):

1. **Name:** Identify one person you’ll walk with.
2. **Pray:** Say their name to God daily; ask for an open door.
3. **Plan:** Before you leave the group tonight, text them: “Thinking of you—coffee this week?”
