 - How does Paul differentiate between permissible actions and beneficial actions?
 - What does Paul mean by saying we must not be mastered by anything?
- Why do you think Paul emphasizes that the body is not meant for sexual immorality but for the Lord?
- What implications does Paul's teaching on sexual immorality have for understanding true intimacy?
- Personal Application: How can you apply the principle of "Intimacy requires exclusivity" in your personal life and relationships? What boundaries can you set to honor this principle?
- Group Application: As a group, discuss ways to support each other in maintaining healthy, exclusive relationships. How can you hold each other accountable in a loving and non-judgmental way?
