Discussion Questions

- If you had to describe Griffin in one word, what would it be?
- What's your favourite place in Griffin?
- If you are a Jesus follower, has there ever been a moment when you realized how much God loves you and gave his son to die for you? How did that moment feel for you?
- Read John 20:19-23.
 - What stands out to you from the passage? What questions do you have about the passage?
 - How does it feel for you to know that you're "sent" by Jesus?
- What comes up for you emotionally when you hear the word "evangelism"?
 - How does rethinking evangelism as "proposing Jesus" rather than "imposing Jesus" change, or challenge, your perspective?
- What are some of the "locked rooms" or comfortable spaces where you keep your faith private?
- Has there ever been a moment in a conversation where you felt God guided your words or actions?
- Is there someone in your life who could use the kind of love Jesus calls us to share?

Weekly Challenge

This week, take a walk around your neighborhood or workplace, praying for three people you often see but don't know well. Ask God to open doors for you to connect with them in meaningful ways.
