Part 3: What To Do When You Don't Know What To Do

P Big Idea

Doubt doesn't have to be an off-ramp to faith; bring it into the journey with Jesus.

Key Scriptures

- Matthew 11:2–6; 11
- Matthew 4:12-13
- Mark 6:18–20

Discussion Questions

- If your week were a weather report, what would it be and why?" (sunny, foggy, scattered showers, thunderstorms, etc.)
- Share one tiny win from this week (found a park, finished a task, good coffee). Prime the room with gratitude.
- What's a platitude you've heard in tough times that didn't help? Why?
- Read Matthew 11:2-6
 - What do you notice about John's honesty? What do you notice about Jesus' reply (reports of God at work... but no rescue for John)?

- Have you ever been disappointed with God or felt his silence? When? (Share to your comfort level.)
- Why might Jesus affirm John (11:11) and still not free him? What does that do to simplistic "cause-and-effect" faith?
- Discuss Jesus' line: "Blessed is anyone who does not stumble on account of me."
 What might "not stumbling" look like this week?
- The New Testament documents the doubts of key figures (including Jesus' "favorites"). How does that normalize your own questions?
- Share a person whose faith inspires you. Does their story come from an "easy life" or a "hard life"?
- Why are faith-in-spite-of-hardship stories so inspiring? Why don't we assume their faith was misplaced?
- A friend struggles to believe because of their circumstances. What would you say to them—and do you believe it for yourself?

Challenge Question (For Takeaway):

1) Honest Prayer (daily):

"Jesus, today I'm doubting _____. Help me not to stumble when you don't act as I expect." (See Matt 11:6.)

2) Spot the Good:

Keep a short list of where you hear/see God at work around you (even if not for you yet).
 Share one item with a friend.

3) Memorize:

Hebrews 4:16.
