Discussion Questions

- What's the most random thing you've lost that drove you crazy until you found it?
- Who in your life is known for being a "finder of lost things"?
- When have you felt found—either by a friend, a group, or God?
- What stood out to you most from Chris's message this week?
- Chris said every church drifts without intentional effort. Why do you think that happens?
 What are signs that a church—or a person—might be drifting?

- Talk through these "drift statements"—which one hits home for you, and why?
 - Toward insiders and away from outsiders
 - Toward law and away from grace
 - Toward preserving and away from advancing
 - Toward comfort and away from calling

Read Luke 15

- What stands out to you from the passage? What questions does it raise for you?
- Why do you think the religious leaders were offended by Jesus spending time with "sinners"?
- 4. In verses 3–7, Jesus compares the lost person to a sheep. What does that imagery reveal about God's character?
- 5. In the story of the lost coin (vv. 8–10), what details stand out to you? What does the woman's search teach us about spiritual pursuit?
- 6. Read Luke 15:11–32 (The Prodigal Son). Which character do you relate to most right now—the younger son, the older brother, or the father?
- 7. In verses 20–24, what's surprising about the father's response? What do you think Jesus wanted His audience to feel in that moment?
- 8. Why do you think the older brother struggles with the father's forgiveness and celebration in verses 28–32? What does that say about human nature—and church culture?
- Who's someone in your life that you would consider "the one" God might be inviting you to reach out to?
- Jesus says all of heaven rejoices when even one person returns to God. What does that tell you about His priorities—and ours?
- When was the last time you prayed specifically for someone far from faith? What's stopping you from doing that regularly?
- Chris said, "Wider starts when you widen your circle." What could that look like practically in your week?

Write down the name of one person you can pray for and pursue this week.

Ask God: "Who's my one?" Then ask, "What's my next step toward them?"
